Opening Sharing Question

1. What do you think a health serving church looks like?

Serve Others with What God Has Given You

Read 1 Corinthians 12

- 2. What does Paul teach about the source, the purpose, and communal natural of what God has given his people (12:4-7, 12-27)
- 3. How does this passage challenge both **feeling unnecessary** and **seeing ourselves as indispensable**? (v14-21)
- 4. In light of v. 7, how might your own **abilities or opportunities** be used to serve others?

Serve Others in Love

Read 1 Corinthians 13

- 5. What is Paul's verdict on ministry exercised **without love** (13:1–3), and how does that reshape how we think about serving?
- 6. Which aspect of love (vv. 4–7) do you find **most challenging in your service**, and how might God grow you there?

Serve Others to Build Up the Church

Read 1 Corinthians 14

- 7. What is Paul's **main concern** in chapter 14 (vv. 3, 5, 12, 26), and how should that shape church gatherings?
- 8. How can our church better **"excel in building up the body"** (14:12)? Where do you personally see an opportunity to do this?

Serving Others Together

- 9. How do 1 Corinthians 12 (gifts), 13 (love), and 14 (edification) work together to form a unified picture of Christian ministry?
- 10. Reflect on how the diagram below can help us think through serving others at church.
- 11. Which of these three questions challenges you most right now? (a) "Am I serving?" (b) "Am I serving in love?" (c) "Am I building others up in Christ?"
- 12. Which ministries in our church currently need love-fuelled servants?
- 13. What is one new step of service you could take in response to this passage?
- 14. Who is one person you could intentionally build up this week—in word, prayer, encouragement, or practical care?
